Question and Answers #1

Question #1: Can you give us examples of how we could meet the Inuit Benefit Plan (IBP)?

Answer #1: Inuit benefits criteria

- Inuit employment: to evaluate the employment of Inuit labour.
- Inuit training and skills development: to evaluate the undertaking of commitments, under the contract, with respect to on-the-job training or skills development for Inuit.
- Inuit ownership (prime contractor and subcontractors): to evaluate whether the bidder is an Inuit
 firm listed on the Inuit firm list maintained by the DIO, and whether Inuit firms will be engaged as
 subcontractor(s) in carrying out the government contract in the Nunavut Settlement Area.

It is agreed that the work requested in this RFSO aims to develop Nunavut's community capacity and readiness when developing a plan of any sort.

- **Question #2:** Will the core group be formalized prior to the facilitator being chosen, or is the group to be formed in collaboration with facilitator and therefore require a matrix to form the group?
- Answer #2: The core group will be formalized prior to the facilitator being chosen although it is not unusual to see additional members join as the process is underway following a deeper understanding of the issues and who should be involved in the planning workshops.
- **Question #3:** Will a different delivery model be considered for Nunavut; will we be able to send more than one resource to deliver the work?
- Answer #3: Same delivery method applies to the Nunavut as in the rest of Canada although we don't foresee delivering a circuit type approach since most communities are fly-in only. For the model B, more than 1 resource will be sent.
- **Question #4:** Do facilitators under another current Standing offer with PS for CSP delivery be needing to apply to this process to deliver CSP in Nunavut?
- Answer #4: Yes, the territory of Nunavut is excluded from previous and future RFSOs due to specific contracting requirements. This RFSO is for work specifically deliver in the Nunavut region exclusively.
