The World Education Services, one of the organizations recommended by the CICIC to conduct this process, does not evaluate short-term certificates.

Specifically, they establish: "Because WES only evaluates academic degrees, WES does not evaluate the United

States Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA) credential, short-term certificates, job training certificates, trade qualifications, career development programs, or other certificates of this nature, as they constitute occupational, rather than academic study."

Considering this, we kindly request that GAC refrains from seeking validation against Canadian standards for the training certificates in the relevant disciplines, as validation is not provided by the cited accredited organization.
