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## PART 1 – GENERAL INFORMATION

### 1.1 Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Offeror Instructions: provides the instructions applicable to the clauses and conditions of the RFSO;
- Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions: provides offerors with instructions on how to prepare their offer to address the evaluation criteria specified;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria which must be addressed in the offer, and the basis of selection;
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 Security, Financial and Insurance Requirements: includes specific requirements that must be addressed by offerors; and
- Part 7 7A, Standing Offer, and 7B, Resulting Contract Clauses:
  - 7A, includes the Standing Offer containing the offer from the Offeror and the applicable clauses and conditions;
  - 7B, includes the clauses and conditions which will apply to any contract resulting from a call-up made pursuant to the Standing Offer.

The Annexes include the Statement of Requirement, the Basis of Payment, the Electronic Payment Instruments and any other annexes.

### 1.2 Summary

- 1.2.1 The Department of National Defence (DND) has a requirement for a National Individual Standing Offer (NISO) to procure Laboratory Blind Testing Material to test laboratory equipment of 13 Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) laboratories across Canada in order to ensure high quality laboratory results and safe practice for patient. The implementation of the proficiency testing in all CAF laboratories must ensure compliance with the Accreditation Canada standards.

Requested Standing Offer period is from Standing Offer award to 31 March 2028.

- 1.2.2 The Request for Standing Offer (RFSO) is to establish a National Individual Standing Offer (NISO) for the requirement detailed in the RFSO, to the Identified Users across Canada, excluding locations within Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, Quebec, and Labrador that are subject to Comprehensive Land Claims Agreements (CLCAs). Any requirement for deliveries to locations within CLCAs areas within Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, Quebec, or Labrador will have to be treated as a separate procurement, outside of the resulting standing offer.



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1.2.3 The requirement is subject to the provisions of the following Trade Agreements:

- a) Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA);
- b) World Trade Organization - Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP);
- c) Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA);
- d) Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP);
- e) Canada-Chile Free Trade Agreement (CCFTA);
- f) Canada -Columbia Free Trade Agreement;
- g) Canada-Honduras Free Trade Agreement;
- h) Canada-Korea Free Trade Agreement;
- i) Canada-Panama Free Trade Agreement;
- j) Canada-Peru Free Trade Agreement (CPFTA);
- k) Canada-Ukraine Free Trade Agreement (CUFTA); and
- l) Canada-United Kingdom Trade Continuity Agreement.

### **1.3 Security Requirements**

A. There is no security requirement associated with the requirement of the Standing Offer.

### **1.4 Debriefings**

A. Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.



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## PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS

### 2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

- A. All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.
- B. Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).
- C. The [2006 \(2023-06-08\)](#) Standard Instructions - Request for Standing Offers - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the RFSO, with the following modification(s):
  - (i) Section 02, Procurement Business Number, is deleted in its entirety;
  - (ii) Section 05, Submission of offers, subsection 2, paragraph d., is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
    - d. send its offer only to the Department of National Defence location specified on page 1 of the RFSO or to the address specified in the RFSO.
  - (iii) Section 05, Submission of offers, subsection 2, paragraph e., is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
    - e. ensure that the Offeror's name, return address, RFSO number, and RFSO closing date and time are clearly visible on the offer;
  - (iv) Section 05, Submission of offers, subsection 4, is amended as follows:

Delete: 60 days  
Insert: 120 days
  - (v) Section 06, Late offers, is deleted in its entirety;
  - (vi) Section 07, Delayed offers, is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

07 Delayed offers

    - 1. It is the Offeror's responsibility to ensure that the Contracting Authority has received the entire submission. Misrouting or other electronic delivery issues resulting in late submission of offers will not be accepted.
  - (vii) Section 08, Transmission by facsimile, is deleted in its entirety; and
  - (viii) Section 20, Further information, is deleted in its entirety.



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#### **D. Technical Difficulties of Bid Transmission**

Despite anything to the contrary in (05), (06) or (08) of the Standard Instructions, where an Offeror has commenced transmission of its offer through an electronic submission method (such as facsimile or Canada Post Corporation's (CPC) Connect service, or other online service) in advance of the RFSO closing date and time, but due to technical difficulties, Canada was unable to receive or decode the entirety of the offer by the deadline, Canada may nonetheless accept the entirety of the offer received after the RFSO closing date and time, provided that the Offeror can demonstrate the following:

- (i) The offeror contacted Canada in advance of the RFSO closing date and time to attempt to resolve its technical difficulties; OR
- (ii) The electronic properties of the offer documentation clearly indicate that all components of the offer were prepared in advance of the RFSO closing date and time.

#### **E. Completeness of the offer**

After the closing date and time of this RFSO, Canada will examine the offer to determine completeness. The review for completeness will be limited to identifying whether any information submitted as part of the offer can be accessed, opened, and/or decoded. This review does not constitute an evaluation of the content, will not assess whether the offer meets any standard or is responsive to all solicitation requirements, but will be solely limited to assessing completeness. Canada will provide the Offeror with the opportunity to submit information found to be missing or incomplete in this review within two business days of notice.

Specifically, the offer will be reviewed and deemed to be complete when the following elements have been submitted by the Offeror:

1. That certifications required at RFSO closing date are included.
2. That offers are properly signed, that the offeror is properly identified.
3. Acceptance of the terms and conditions of the RFSO and resulting contract.
4. That all documents created prior to RFSO closing date but due to technical difficulties Canada was unable to receive them, have been properly submitted and received by Canada.
5. All certifications, declarations and proofs created prior to RFSO closing date but due to technical difficulties Canada was unable to receive them, have been properly submitted and received by Canada.

#### **2.2 Submission of Offers**

- A. Offers must be submitted only to the Department of National Defence (DND) by the date, time, and place indicated on page 1 of the RFSO.
- B. Due to the nature of the RFSO, offers transmitted by facsimile will not be accepted.



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## 2.2.1 Electronic Submissions

- A. **Individual e-mails that may include certain scripts, formats, embedded macros and/or links, or those that exceed five (5) megabytes may be rejected by Canada's e-mail system and/or firewall(s) without notice to the Bidder or Contracting Authority.** Larger offers may be submitted through more than one e-mail. Canada will confirm receipt of documents. It is the Offeror's responsibility to ensure that their entire submission has been received. Offerors should not assume that all documents have been received unless Canada confirms receipt of each document. In order to minimize the potential for technical issues, offerors are requested to allow sufficient time before the closing date and time to confirm receipt. Offer documents **submitted** after the closing time and date will not be accepted.

## 2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

- A. All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than 15 calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.
- B. Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

## 2.4 Applicable Laws

- A. The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario Ontario [or as specified by the offeror in its offer, if applicable].
- B. Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the offerors.

## 2.5 Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms

- A. Several mechanisms are available to potential offerors to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.
- B. Canada encourages offerors to first bring their concerns to the attention of the Contracting Authority. Canada's [Buy and Sell](#) website, under the heading "[Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms](#)" contains information on potential complaint bodies such as:
- Office of the Procurement Ombudsman (OPO)
  - Canadian International Trade Tribunal (CITT)



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- C. Offerors should note that there are **strict deadlines** for filing complaints, and the time periods vary depending on the complaint body in question. Offerors should therefore act quickly when they want to challenge any aspect of the procurement process.



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## PART 3 - OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

### 3.1 Offer Preparation Instructions

- A. Canada requests that the Offeror provides its offer in separately bound sections as follows:
  - Section I: Technical Offer one (1) soft copy in PDF format by e-mail;
  - Section II: Financial Offer one (1) soft copy in PDF format by e-mail;
  - Section III: Certifications one (1) soft copy in PDF format by e-mail; and
  - Section IV: Additional Information one (1) soft copy in PDF format by e-mail.
- B. Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.
- C. Canada requests that Offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their offer:
  - (i) Use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper; and
  - (ii) Use a numbering system that corresponds to the RFSO.

### 3.2 Section I: Technical Offer

- A. In their technical offer, offerors should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

### 3.3 Section II: Financial Offer

- A. Offerors must submit their financial offer in accordance with the Pricing Schedule detailed in Attachment 1 to Part 3.

#### 3.3.1 Electronic Payment of Invoices – Offer

- A. If you are willing to accept payment of invoices by Electronic Payment Instruments, complete Attachment 2 to Part 3, Electronic Payment Instruments, to identify which ones are accepted.
- B. If Attachment 2 to Part 3, Electronic Payment Instruments is not completed, it will be considered as if Electronic Payment Instruments are not being accepted for payment of invoices.
- C. Acceptance of Electronic Payment Instruments will not be considered as an evaluation criterion.

#### 3.1.2 Exchange Rate Fluctuation

- A. The requirement does not offer exchange rate fluctuation risk mitigation. Requests for exchange rate fluctuation risk mitigation will not be considered. All offers including such provision will render the offer non-responsive.



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### **3.4    Section III: Certifications**

- A. Offerors must submit the certifications and additional information required under Part 5.

### **3.5    Section IV: Additional Information**

- A. In Section IV of their offer, offerors should provide:

- (i) A completed, signed, and dated Page 1 of this solicitation;
- (ii) The name of the contact person (provide also this person's title, mailing address, phone number, and email address) authorized by the Offeror to enter into communications with Canada with regards to their bid, and any contract that may result from their offer;
- (iv) For Part 2, article 2.4, Applicable Laws, of the bid solicitation: the province or territory if different than specified;  
and
- (v) Any other information submitted in the bid not already detailed.



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### **ATTACHMENT 1 TO PART 3 - PRICING SCHEDULE**

- A. The Offeror must complete this pricing schedule and include it in its financial offer.
- B. The volumetric data included in this pricing schedule are provided for offer evaluated price determination purposes only. They are not to be considered as a contractual guarantee. Their inclusion in this pricing schedule does not represent a commitment by Canada that Canada's future usage of the services described in the RFSO will be consistent with this data.
- C. The firm rates specified below includes all expenses that may need to be incurred to satisfy the terms of any Standing Offer that may result from its offer, including the total estimated cost that may be incurred to carry out the work described in Annex A – Statement of Requirement.
- D. Under any resulting contract, Canada will not accept travel and living expenses that may need to be incurred by the contractor for any relocation of resources required to satisfy its contractual obligations.
- E. All prices and costs must be submitted in Canadian Dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, DDP (Delivered Duty Paid) Incoterms 2010 for shipments from a commercial contractor, including delivery charges, administration, costs and risks of transport and customs clearance, including the payment of customs duties and Applicable Taxes.
- F. A Microsoft Excel version of the Pricing Schedule is attached to the RFSO. If there is any difference in the information in the Excel document and the pricing schedule below, the pricing schedule below takes precedence.

#### 4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

- A. The price of the offer will be evaluated as follows:
- (i) Canadian-based offerors must submit firm prices, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included, and Applicable Taxes excluded.
  - (ii) foreign-based offerors must submit firm prices, Canadian customs duties, excise taxes and Applicable Taxes excluded. Canadian customs duties and excise taxes payable by Canada will be added, for evaluation purposes only, to the prices submitted by foreign-based offerors.
- B. Unless the Request for Standing Offer (RFSO) specifically requires offers to be submitted in Canadian currency, offers submitted in foreign currency will be converted to Canadian currency for evaluation purposes. The rate given by the Bank of Canada in effect on the RFSO closing date, or on another date specified in the RFSO, will be applied as a conversion factor to the offers submitted in foreign currency.
- C. Although Canada reserves the right to issue the Standing Offer either on an FOB plant or FOB destination, Canada requests that offerors provide prices FOB their plant or shipping point and FOB destination. Offers will be assessed on an FOB destination basis.
- D. For the purpose of the RFSO, offerors with an address in Canada are considered Canadian-based offerors, and offerors with an address outside of Canada are considered foreign-based offerors.



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#### 4.2 Basis of Selection

##### 4.2.1 Basis of Selection - Highest Combined Rating of Technical Merit (60%) and Price (40%)

- A. To be declared responsive, a offer must:
  - (i) comply with all the requirements of the offer solicitation; and
  - (ii) meet all mandatory criteria; and
  - (iii) obtain the required minimum of 24 points overall for the technical evaluation criteria which are subject to point rating. The rating is performed on a scale of 40 points.
- B. Offers not meeting (i) or (ii) or (iii) will be declared non-responsive.
- C. The selection will be based on the highest responsive combined rating of technical merit and price. The ratio will be 60% for the technical merit and 40% for the price.
- D. To establish the technical merit score, the overall technical score for each responsive offer will be determined as follows: total number of points obtained / maximum number of points available multiplied by the ratio of 60%.
- E. To establish the pricing score, each responsive offer will be prorated against the lowest evaluated price and the ratio of 40%.
- F. For each responsive offer, the technical merit score and the pricing score will be added to determine its combined rating.
- G. Neither the responsive offer obtaining the highest technical score nor the one with the lowest evaluated price will necessarily be accepted. The responsive offer with the highest combined rating of technical merit and price will be recommended for award of a standing offer.

The table below illustrates an example where all three offers are responsive and the selection of the contractor is determined by a 60/40 ratio of technical merit and price, respectively. The total available points equals 135 and the lowest evaluated price is \$45,000 (45).

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- H. Should two (2) or more responsive offers achieve an identical lowest evaluated price, the earliest offer received based on the date and time stamp of the email, will be recommended for award of a standing offer.



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## PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- A. Offerors must provide the required certifications and additional information to be issued a standing offer.
- B. The certifications provided by offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.
- C. The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority will render the offer non-responsive, result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

  - confirmation that the user is an Identified User under the Standing Offer with authority to enter into a contract.

#### **6.10 Limitation of Call-ups**

- A. Individual call-ups against the Standing Offer must not exceed \$25,000.00 (Applicable Taxes included).

#### **6.11 Financial Limitation**

- A. The total cost to Canada resulting from call ups against the Standing Offer must not exceed the sum of \$\_\_\_\_\_ (*Applicable Taxes excluded*) [To be detailed in the resulting standing offer] unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Standing Offer Authority. The Offeror must not perform any work or services or supply any articles in response to call ups which would cause the total cost to Canada to exceed the said sum, unless an increase is so authorized.
- B. The Offeror must notify the Standing Offer Authority as to the adequacy of this sum when 75 percent of this amount has been committed, or three (3) months before the expiry date of the Standing Offer, whichever comes first. However, if at any time, the Offeror considers that the said sum may be exceeded, the Offeror must promptly notify the Standing Offer Authority.

#### **6.12 Priority of Documents**

- A. If there is a discrepancy between the wording of any documents that appear on the list, the wording of the document that first appears on the list has priority over the wording of any document that subsequently appears on the list.
- (i) the call up against the Standing Offer, including any annexes;

  - (vi) Annex A, Statement of Requirement;
  - (vii) Annex B, Basis of Payment;
  - (viii) the Offeror's offer dated \_\_\_\_\_ (*insert date of offer*), (*if the offer was clarified or amended, insert at the time of issuance of the offer*. "as clarified on \_\_\_\_\_" **or** "as amended on \_\_\_\_\_" and *insert date(s) of clarification(s) or amendment(s) if applicable*).



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## 6.13 Certifications and Additional Information

### 6.13.1 Compliance

- A. Unless specified otherwise, the continuous compliance with the certifications provided by the Offeror with its offer or precedent to issuance of the Standing Offer (SO), and the ongoing cooperation in providing additional information are conditions of issuance of the SO and failure to comply will constitute the Offeror in default. Certifications are subject to verification by Canada during the entire period of the SO and of any resulting contract that would continue beyond the period of the SO.

## 6.14 Applicable Laws

- A. The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in **Ontario [or as specified by the offeror in its offer, if applicable]**.



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## B. RESULTING CONTRACT CLAUSES

- A. The following clauses and conditions apply to and form part of any contract resulting from a call-up against the Standing Offer.

### 6.1 Statement of Requirement

- A. The Contractor must provide the items detailed in the call-up against the Standing Offer.

### 6.2 Standard Clauses and Conditions

#### 6.2.1 General Conditions

- A. [2010A \(2022-12-01\)](#), General Conditions - Goods (Medium Complexity) apply to and form part of the Contract.

#### 6.2.2 Supplemental General Conditions

### 6.3 Term of Contract

#### 6.3.1 Period of the Contract

- A. The period for raising call-ups against the Standing Offer is from Standing Offer date to 31 March 2028.

#### 6.3.2 Delivery Date

- A. Delivery must be completed in accordance with the call-up against the Standing Offer.

### 6.4 Payment

#### 6.4.1 Basis of Payment

- A. In consideration of the Contractor satisfactorily completing all of its obligations under the Contract, the Contractor will be paid a firm price, as specified in Annex B – Basis of Payment.

#### 6.4.2 Limitation of Price

- A. Canada will not pay the Contractor for any design changes, modifications or interpretations of the Work, unless they have been approved, in writing, by the Contracting Authority before their incorporation into the Work.

#### 6.4.3 Multiple Payments

- A. Canada will pay the Contractor upon completion and delivery of units in accordance with the payment provisions of the Contract if:

- (i) an accurate and complete invoice and any other documents required by the Contract have been submitted in accordance with the invoicing instructions provided in the Contract;



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- (ii) all such documents have been verified by Canada;
- (iii) the Work delivered has been accepted by Canada.

#### **6.4.4 Taxes - Foreign-based Contractor**

- A. Unless specified otherwise in the Contract, the price includes no amount for any federal excise tax, state or local sales or use tax, or any other tax of a similar nature, or any Canadian tax whatsoever. The price, however, includes all other taxes. If the Work is normally subject to federal excise tax, Canada will, upon request, provide the Contractor a certificate of exemption from such federal excise tax in the form prescribed by the federal regulations.
- B. Canada will provide the Contractor evidence of export that may be requested by the tax authorities. If, as a result of Canada's failure to do so, the Contractor has to pay federal excise tax, Canada will reimburse the Contractor if the Contractor takes such steps as Canada may require to recover any payment made by the Contractor. The Contractor must refund to Canada any amount so recovered.

#### **6.4.5 Electronic Payment of Invoices – Call-up**

- A. The Contractor accepts to be paid using any of the following Electronic Payment Instrument(s):

  - (iii) One (1) copy must be forwarded via email to the Standing Offer Authority identified under the section entitled "Authorities" of Part 6 – Standing Offer and Resulting Contract Clauses. The contract number and contracting officer must be entered in the subject line of the email.

#### **6.6 Insurance - No Specific Requirement**

- A. The Contractor is responsible for deciding if insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any insurance acquired or maintained by the Contractor is at its own expense and for its own benefit and protection. It does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract.



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One (1) of the following two (2) options will be inserted in the resulting contract, as applicable:

Option 1: A2000C (2006-06-16) when the contract is to be with a Canadian-based supplier; or

#### 6.7 Foreign Nationals (Canadian Contractor)

- A. The Contractor must comply with Canadian immigration requirements applicable to foreign nationals entering Canada to work temporarily in fulfillment of the Contract. If the Contractor wishes to hire a foreign national to work in Canada to fulfill the Contract, the Contractor should immediately contact the nearest Service Canada regional office to enquire about Citizenship and Immigration Canada's requirements to issue a temporary work permit to a foreign national. The Contractor is responsible for all costs incurred as a result of non-compliance with immigration requirements.

Option 2: A2001C (2006-06-16) when the contract is to be with a foreign-based supplier.

#### 6.7 Foreign Nationals (Foreign Contractor)

- A. The Contractor must comply with Canadian immigration legislation applicable to foreign nationals entering Canada to work temporarily in fulfillment of the Contract. If the Contractor wishes to hire a foreign national to work in Canada to fulfill the Contract, the Contractor should immediately contact the nearest Canadian Embassy, Consulate or High Commission in the Contractor's country to obtain instructions, information on Citizenship and Immigration Canada's requirements and any required documents. The Contractor is responsible to ensure that foreign nationals have the required information, documents and authorizations before performing any work under the Contract in Canada. The Contractor is responsible for all costs incurred as a result of non-compliance with immigration requirements.

#### 6.8 Defence Contract

- A. The Contract is a defence contract within the meaning of the *Defence Production Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. D-1, and must be governed accordingly.
- B. Title to the Work or to any materials, parts, work-in-process or finished work must belong to Canada free and clear of all claims, liens, attachments, charges or encumbrances. Canada is entitled, at any time, to remove, sell or dispose of the Work or any part of the Work in accordance with section 20 of the *Defence Production Act*.

#### 6.9 Excess Goods

- A. The quantity of goods to be delivered by the Contractor is specified in the Contract. The Contractor remains liable for any shipment in excess of that quantity whether the excess quantity is shipped voluntarily or as a result of an error by the Contractor. Canada will not make any payment to the Contractor for goods shipped in excess of the specified quantity. Canada will not return the said goods to the Contractor unless the Contractor agrees to pay for all the costs related to the return, including but not limited to administrative, shipping and handling costs. Canada will have the right to deduct such costs from any invoice submitted by the Contractor.

#### 6.10 Transportation of Dangerous Goods/Hazardous Products

- A. The Contractor must obtain the authorization from the Department of Transport to transport dangerous goods/hazardous products before the carrier may accept a charter involving the transportation of dangerous goods/hazardous products.



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#### **6.11 Shipment of Dangerous Goods/Hazardous Products**

- A. The Contractor must label and ship dangerous goods/hazardous products falling within the Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act, 1992, c.34 and the Hazardous Products Act, R.S.C. 1985, c. H-3 and their regulation(s) in accordance with the said Acts and regulation(s) accompanied by the required safety data sheet(s) completed in both English and French.

#### **6.12 Delivery of Dangerous Goods/Hazardous Products**

- A. The Contractor must mark dangerous goods/hazardous products which are classed as dangerous/hazardous as follows:
1. shipping container - in accordance with the Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act, 1992, c. 34; and
  2. immediate product container - in accordance with the Hazardous Products Act, R.S., 1985, c. H-3.
- B. The Contractor must provide bilingual Safety Data Sheets, indicating the NATO Stock Number as follows:

- C. The Contractor will be responsible for any damages caused by improper packaging, labelling or carriage of dangerous goods/hazardous products.
- D. The Contractor must ensure they adhere to all levels of regulations regarding dangerous goods/hazardous products as set forth by federal, provincial and municipal laws and by-laws.
- E. The Contractor must contact the consignee (i.e. Supply Depot Traffic Section) at least 48 hours before shipping dangerous goods/hazardous products in order to schedule a receiving time.

#### **6.13 Dangerous Goods / Hazardous Products - Labelling and Packaging Compliance**

- A. The Contractor must ensure proper labelling and packaging in the supply and shipping of dangerous goods/hazardous products to the Government of Canada.
- B. The Contractor will be held liable for any damages caused by improper packaging, labelling or carriage of dangerous goods/hazardous products..



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- C. The Contractor must clearly mark all merchandise labels with the percentage of volume that is a hazardous item. Failure to do so will result in the Contractor being held responsible for damages caused in the movement of goods/products by government vehicles or government personnel.
- D. The Contractor must adhere to all applicable laws regarding dangerous goods/hazardous products.

#### **6.14 Shipping Instructions - Delivery at Destination**

- A. Goods must be consigned to the destination specified in the Contract and delivered:
  - (i) Delivered Duty Paid (DDP), at locations detailed in Appendix 1 of Annex A, Incoterms 2010 for shipments from a commercial contractor.

#### **6.15 Inspection and Acceptance**

- A. The Project Authority identified in the call-up is the Inspection Authority. All reports, deliverable items, documents, goods and all services rendered under the Contract are subject to inspection by the Inspection Authority or representative. Should any report, document, good or service not be in accordance with the requirements of the Statement of Work and to the satisfaction of the Inspection Authority, as submitted, the Inspection Authority will have the right to reject it or require its correction at the sole expense of the Contractor before recommending payment.

#### **6.16 Dispute Resolution**

- A. The parties agree to maintain open and honest communication about the Work throughout and after the performance of the contract.
- B. The parties agree to consult and co-operate with each other in the furtherance of the contract and promptly notify the other party or parties and attempt to resolve problems or differences that may arise.
- C. If the parties cannot resolve a dispute through consultation and cooperation, the parties agree to consult a neutral third party offering alternative dispute resolution services to attempt to address the dispute.

Department of National Defence (DND) Canadian Forces Health Services (CFHS) support the health of 65000 military members and produces approximately 1,600,000 workload units per year. There are 13 laboratories across Canada that provides external testing.

As per Accreditation Canada standard, ISO 15189 - article 3.8 and CSA Z902-10 - article 4.3.3, the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) laboratories are required to have a proficiency testing program for most of the test performed in the clinics. Therefore, CFHS must test the equipment of all laboratories. A minimum of three (3) events per program per year are mandatory in order to maintain its accreditation.

#### 2. OBJECTIVE

The objective is to acquire Laboratory Blind Testing Material to test laboratory equipment to ensure high quality laboratory results and safe practice for patient. The implementation of the proficiency testing in all CAF laboratories must ensure compliance with the Accreditation Canada standards.

#### 3. SCOPE

CFHS through DND has a requirement to acquire Laboratory Blind Testing Material to test laboratory equipment of 13 CAF laboratories across Canada which are located in Halifax, Greenwood, Gagetown, Borden, Valcartier, St-Jean, Petawawa, Trenton, Kingston, Edmonton, Cold Lake, Esquimalt and Winnipeg. After receipt of the results of tests conducted by the various DND laboratories, the Contractor must create statistical reports for each event.
