Notably recommendations from the 2021 Lifeways AIA report were executed in a 2022 field program for additional archaeological investigation.

- Q2. Based on the previous recoveries/observations, is there a need for material conservation services to be provided by the Consultant or expectation for us to include a material conservator in our proposal package?
- No. Parks Canada has conservators available to do this work. Bidders/Consultants should not plan A2. to provide a material conservator in proposal.
- Q3. Relative to logistical planning we would likely ship equipment up earlier than the field crew; would there be a Parks Canada storage facility and personnel available to receive/store that equipment?

A3. Parks Canada has very limited availability of staff in Tulita through the summer and into the early fall 2024, and therefore cannot commit to timely or responsive personnel support for equipment or material receiving, storage and management.

The Consultant shall be responsible for both material and equipment management (personnel required for such), transportation (vehicle rentals), and all other logistical coordination required for the duration of the work in Tulita, and for any support required after field work is complete. It is recommended for bidders to plan to engage with local community members on potential involvement in materials / equipment receiving and management or coordination, in addition to alternative equipment lay-down areas or locations.

For physical storage locations, Parks Canada can provide the consultants with unsecured outdoor storage on the subject property at 30 Bear Rock Drive. Parks Canada can provide an area limited to 8 square-metres total of floor space, split between a small shed on the property, and a separate shipping container off-site at 28 Mackenzie Drive. Both sheds have basic padlocks on exterior as 'security', and a key can be transferred in Tulita. Consultants are responsible for assuring security of contents of each shed while in use.

- Q4. Given Tulita's small size and limited accommodations, does Parks Canada have any available accommodations at Tulita (beyond the Two Rivers Hotel)?
- A4. Bidders shall assume for the purposes of bidding that they need to provide their own accommodations in Tulita.

Alternative accommodations in Tulita other than Two Rivers Hotel includes the MYB Construction Camp, or contact other businesses on the Tulita District Business Registry [https://tulitahamlet.ca/business/] for additional options.

- Q5. Is the 30-day window for draft reporting negotiable, to allow for e.g., AMS dating of recovered materials and/or high number of artifacts/cultural materials?
- A5. Parks Canada will allow forty-five (45) days following completion of field work to receive an Archaeological Mitigation and Assessment - Draft Report. Parks Canada will allow for negotiations on the timelines outlined to be mutually agreed upon by Parks Canada and the Consultant. Note that Parks Canada wishes to avoid risks to the construction schedule resultant from any delays to reporting following archaeological field work.
- Q6. Are we required to be approved under the Terrestrial Archaeology Services - Supply Arrangement 5P300-23-0054/A in order to bid on this requirement for Archaeological Services -Tulita, NT - 5P420-24-0018/A?
- A6. No. These are two (2) separate requirements, and are unrelated to the other. Please consider Archaeological Services – Tulita, NT – 5P420-24-0018/A as its own requirement.
