2. In the case of an identical resource or identical resources proposed by more than one bidder

Following validation of the consent or proof of employment, if the successful bidder's proposed resource withdraws or becomes unable to provide the services before the contract award, the resource will no longer be considered from any other bidder who offered that same resource for the performance of the contract.

3. Replacement of a resource prior to contract award

If the successful bidder's proposed resource recommended for the contract award withdraws and/or becomes unable to provide its services for the performance of the contract, at any time between the closing date and time of the RFP and the award of the contract, the bidder must immediately inform the contracting authority of the reason for the replacement.

The bidder must propose, at the same hourly rate indicated in its bid, one replacement who must meet all of the mandatory requirements contained in the RFP and, if applicable, obtains an equal or higher score obtained by the originally proposed resource on the point rated criteria of the RFP. Upon request by the contracting authority and within the time allowed (minimum of one business day), the bidder must provide the necessary information to allow assessment of the replacement, including but not limited to, its name, qualifications and experience. Failure to respond to the request will result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

4. Bid challenge and recourse mechanisms

Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.

5.1 Period of contract

5.2 Maximum duration of contracts

A contract awarded under the THS for the NCR supply arrangement must not exceeds 48 consecutive weeks including all absences.

On an exceptional basis only, a contract may be amended to extend the duration of an assignment period up to a maximum of 24 consecutive weeks beyond the limit of 48 consecutive weeks (example total extended duration must not exceed 72 consecutive weeks) on the condition that the following requirements are met:

- i. the duration of the assignment period, including any contract amendments that impact the assignment period, must be more than 40 consecutive weeks;
- ii. the amendment to extend the duration of the assignment period must be issued after the first 40 consecutive weeks of the assignment period; and
- iii. the contracting authority must notify THS for the NCR of the issued amendment by email within 2 business days of issuing the amendment.

The contractor agrees that, during the extended periods of the contract, it will be paid in accordance with the applicable provisions as set out in Annex B: Basis of payment.

6.0 Authorities

6.1 Contracting authority

8.1.1 Travel and living expenses

The Contractor will be reimbursed for the authorized travel and living expenses reasonably and properly incurred in the performance of the Work, at cost, in accordance with Contract Cost Principles 1031-2, with no allowance for profit and/or administrative overhead. All payments are subject to government audit.

Canada will not accept any travel and living expenses incurred by the contractor in the performance of the work, for:

8.2 Method of payment

Canada will pay the contractor on a monthly basis for work performed during the month covered by the invoice in accordance with the payment provisions of the contract if:

- an accurate and complete invoice and any other documents required by the contract have been submitted in accordance with the invoicing instructions provided at 8.2.1 below;
- all such documents have been verified by Canada;
- the work performed has been accepted by Canada.

9.0 Certifications compliance

Unless specified otherwise, the continuous compliance with the certifications provided by the contractor in its bid or precedent to contract award, and the ongoing cooperation in providing additional information are conditions of the contract and failure to comply will constitute the contractor in default. 12.0 Discretionary audit - non-commercial goods and/or services

The estimated amount of profit included in the contractor's price or rate certification is subject to audit by Canada, before or after payment is made to the contractor under the conditions of the contract. The purpose of the audit would be to determine whether the actual profit earned on a single contract if only one exists, or the aggregate of actual profit earned by the contractor on a series of negotiated firm price and fixed-time rate contracts performed during a particular period selected, is reasonable and justifiable based on the estimated amount of profit included in earlier price or rate certification(s).

If the audit demonstrates that the actual profit is not reasonable and justifiable, as defined above, the contractor must repay Canada the amount found to be in excess.

13.0 Foreign nationals (Canadian contractor)

ANNEX A - Statement of work

1. Scope

1.1. Objective

• This THS is required to fill critical gaps in work capacity. Specifically Command and Control (C2) application & operating systems and subsystems expertise to foster effective development, integration, synchronization and operationalization of the Canadian Armed Forces' (CAF) Joint Operations Fusion Laboratory (JOFL) in support of the Directorate of Joint Capability Development (DJCD) within the Canadian Joint Operations Command (CJOC).

1.2. Background

- CJOC anticipates and conducts CAF operations, less those undertaken by the Canadian Special Operations Forces Command (CANSOFCOM) and the North American Aerospace Defence Command (NORAD), and develops, force generates and integrates joint force capabilities for operations. Accordingly, DJCD has a responsibility, on behalf of the Commander CJOC through the Director General Readiness (DG Readiness) to integrate, harmonize and synchronize capability development activities across the Command and the CAF in order to build and maintain a balanced set of operational capabilities.
- As part of the DJCD, the Command, Control, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (C2ISR) Team has developed the JOFL as the CAF catalyst for the improvement and transformation of CAF operational command and control (C2), Joint Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (JISR) and targeting enterprises bringing effective operational solutions through informed analysis, trials, experimentation and joint exercises. In short, the Lab is an innovation hub for operational information and intelligence fusion in support of both Pan-Domain C2 and Pan-Domain awareness.

Requirement

2.1. Scope of work

On behalf of the Canadian Joint Operations Command (CJOC) Directorate of Capability Development (DJCD) Joint Operations Fusion Lab (JOFL) Team Lead, the resource is required to manage CIS command and control applications, operating systems or subsystems that are used to provide ubiquitous on demand network access to a shared pool of Command, Control, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (C4ISR) products that can be rapidly provisioned and released with minimal management effort for the establishment of Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) C4ISR capabilities to include but not limited to trials, evaluations, experiments and exercises. 2.3. Tasks

- Plan, design, direct and support CAF C4ISR application interconnectivity and interdependencies with CAF platforms and allied networks, including dissemination of application information on Canadian networks, transport of information between Canada, U.S. and other allied nations:
- Participate in design, implementation and testing of open architecture applications;
- Operate, maintain, sustain, troubleshoot and repair C2 applications, operating systems and subsystems to include but not limited to distributed baseline applications, storage, messaging and targeting;
- Manage application-centric content delivery to multiple users, domains and information systems;
- Administer C4ISR applications to include monitoring required to provision, sustain, operate and integrate C2 and JISR systems and applications in the enterprise baseline and deployed networks;
- Support application and baseline characterization, identification, reconnaissance and remediation of vulnerabilities while enhancing capabilities to achieve desired effects;
- Provide network application resources by designing, configuring, installing and managing data services, operating system and server-based applications;
- 8. Manage and perform planning, implementation and ensure baseline application architecture, configuration and integration conformity:
- Install new C2 and baseline applications, as well as upgrade, replace, configure and maintain equipment supporting CAF ISR capabilities;
- Establish priorities, maintain, test, troubleshoot and repair operating systems and applications utilizing tools and test equipment;
- 11. Monitor performance of the operating system and C2 applications within JISR systems and coordinate with inter-agencies and outside organizations to analyze and isolate performance faults and implement necessary corrective actions;
- Establish integration of current and planned CAF and RCAF ISR C2 applications and subsequent data into the CAF ISR enterprise;
- Coordinate the build and test plans and environments of ISR networks integrating RCAF sensors and platforms with United States Air Force (USAF) Distributed Common Ground System (DCGS) and CAF Joint PED Centre (within the Joint Intelligence Operations Centre (JIOC));
- 14. Produce operational and system views (OV1 and SV1) to support initial operating capability (IOC) of RCAF ISR platforms such as but not limited to RPAS, CP-140;
- 15. Prepare various briefing slides and written reports on baseline operating system configuration and application architectures for peers and CAF JISR team management;
- 16. Collaborate with CJWC staff and other organizations as required to identify baseline C2 application, operating system and subsystems required to support operations of the JOFL;

- 17. Participate in related C2ISR working groups, meetings and discussions, both internal and external to the JOFL & FD-SIL, as required;
- 18. Assist in establishing fostering and maintaining collaborative relationships with the DIMEI community, other CAF and Allied warfare centers and labs;
- 19. Develop and provide updates to DJCD Staff and CANSOFCOM DFD Staff as requested; and
- 20. Assist the DJDC JOFL Lead in completing any other JOFL & application development tasks and activities related to C2, JISR and targeting trials, evaluations, experiments, and exercises.
